West Coast Cub Fly-In Returning to Lompoc Airport *Public is invited to this popular annual gathering of historic airplanes*

LOMPOC, CA, June 30, 2017 – The popular West Coast Cub Fly-In will soon be landing at the Lompoc Airport.

The annual gathering of historic, World War II-era airplanes is returning to the Lompoc Airport, 1801 N. H St., for the 33rd year. The event will be held **July 7** through **July 9**, and there is no charge for spectator admission. The event was started by Monty Findley and Bruce Fall, two Lompoc Piper Cub owners, and draws pilots from around the country.

The West Coast Cub Fly-In features pilot proficiency contests, and provides attendees with the chance to walk among the aircraft and speak to the pilots. Vintage biplane and Piper Cub rides are also available.

In addition, food and beverages, as well as souvenirs, will be available for purchase.

City of Lompoc

The City of Lompoc, known as “The City of Arts and Flowers”, was founded as a town in 1874 and incorporated as a city on Aug. 13, 1888. Prior to the City’s establishment, the building of La Purisima Mission in 1787 marked the earliest European settlement in the Lompoc Valley. Growth in the Lompoc Valley was sparked by the 1901 completion of the coastal railroad between San Francisco and Los Angeles, which included the extension of a spur into Lompoc. The Lompoc Valley is home to Vandenberg Air Force Base, the first missile base of the United States Air Force. Today, the City of Lompoc is a travel destination known for its downtown mural program, local wines and acclaimed cuisine, historic landmarks, parks and nearby beaches.
