Lompoc City Council Votes To Adopt City Budget

LOMPOC, CA, Sept. 6, 2017 – The Lompoc City Council voted 3-2 at Tuesday night’s council meeting to adopt a municipal budget for fiscal years 2017-2019.

Lompoc City Council adopted [Resolution No. 6135\(17\)](#), which was presented by City Manager Patrick Wiemiller. Voting in favor of adopting the resolution were councilmembers Dirk Starbuck, Victor Vega and Jim Mosby.

Mosby made the motion to adopt the resolution with the changes of adding back in \$93,500 to fund school crossing guards and \$12,200 in park maintenance money. Mosby indicated funding for those items would be obtained from the \$200,000 reduction he proposed by not including the money set forth in the budget related to tax ballot measures that could be proposed by the city for the November 2018 general election.

The approved city budget will go into effect as soon as the resolution adopting that budget is signed by Mayor Bob Lingl.

The Lompoc City Council will reconvene at its next regular meeting on Sept. 19.

City of Lompoc

The City of Lompoc was founded as a town in 1874 and incorporated as a city on Aug. 13, 1888. Prior to the City’s establishment, the building of La Purisima Mission in 1787 marked the earliest European settlement in the Lompoc Valley. Growth in the Lompoc Valley was sparked by the 1901 completion of the coastal railroad between San Francisco and Los Angeles, which included the extension of a spur into Lompoc. The Lompoc Valley is home to Vandenberg Air Force Base, the first missile base of the United States Air Force. Today, the City of Lompoc is a travel destination known for its downtown mural program, local wines and acclaimed cuisine, historic landmarks, parks and nearby beaches.
