Lompoc Invites Public Comment On Fiscal Year 2018-19 Action Plan

Thirty-day public review period runs May 14 through June 12

LOMPOC, CA, May 11, 2018 – The City of Lompoc Economic and Community Development Department invites public comment on the city’s Fiscal Year 2018-19 Action Plan.

The draft 2018-19 Action Plan discusses how the City of Lompoc will implement the Consolidated Plan during the fiscal year, and includes a list of programs and projects that are being recommended for funding with federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. The draft FY 2018-2019 Action Plan, including funding recommendations, will be considered by Lompoc City Council at a **public hearing on June 5, 2018**, during which the council will make final funding decisions. The final FY 2018-19 Action Plan will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). CDBG Funds available to award to projects and programs for FY 2018-19 is estimated to be \$475,018.00.

The draft 2018-19 Action Plan will be made available for a 30-day public review with a comment period from **Monday, May 14, 2018 through and including Tuesday, June 12, 2018**.

The draft documents will be available for review at cityoflompoc.com/comdev/, the Lompoc Public Library located at 501 East North Avenue in Lompoc, and at Lompoc City Hall, 100 Civic Center Plaza. City of Lompoc

The City of Lompoc was founded as a town in 1874 and incorporated as a city on Aug. 13, 1888. Prior to the City’s establishment, the building of La Purisima Mission in 1787 marked the earliest European settlement in the Lompoc Valley. Growth in the Lompoc Valley was sparked by the 1901 completion of the coastal railroad between San Francisco and Los Angeles, which included the extension of a spur into Lompoc.
