SUBJECT: Approve, and Direct the Purchasing and Materials Manager to Issue Purchase Orders for Purchase of Police Patrol Vehicles with Upfits to Winner Chevrolet in the Combined Amount of \$730,216.39

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council award and approve the attached contracts and purchase orders that are in excess of \$100,000, and direct the Purchasing and Materials Manager to issue the purchase orders:

- 1) Police Patrol vehicles with upfits to include seven (7) patrol units and one (1) canine (K9) unit to Winner Chevrolet in the amount of \$730,216.39 (Attachments 1 and 2).

Discussion:

Police Patrol Vehicles

Use of Statewide Contract Fleet Vehicles for Procurement

The Statewide Contracts for Fleet Vehicles competitively solicited cooperative contracts and their process conforms with the Lompoc Municipal Code and reduces procurement costs by eliminating much of the process of creating Bid and RFP documents. For the purchase of the Police Department replacement vehicles and related attachments, a procurement awarded to Winner Chevrolet is proposed.

Quotations No. 10138A and 10139A were issued by Winner Chevrolet on August 25, 2025, based upon California Statewide Contract for Fleet Vehicles # 1-22-23-23D which can be found on the California State website at:

The State's Statewide Contracts for Fleet Vehicles provide Fleet Vehicles at contracted pricing to the State of California and local governmental agencies.

Fiscal Impact:

All costs related to these bids and purchases are included in the adopted Biennial Budget Fiscal Years 2025-27.

The Police Patrol vehicles with upfits purchases are to be paid by the Fleet Fund 872, from monies previously received from the General Fund and assigned specifically for General Fund vehicle replacements. The purchases are to be paid out of account 872ESR-753631, Police Patrol Cars, and follow the established Fleet replacement schedule. No additional appropriations are requested and there is no FY 2025-27 impact to the General Fund as a result of the purchase of the patrol vehicles.

Conclusion:

The purchase of police patrol vehicles with upfits provide important fleet replacements, have been established using competitive purchasing methods, and are included in the Biennial Budget FYs 2025-27.
