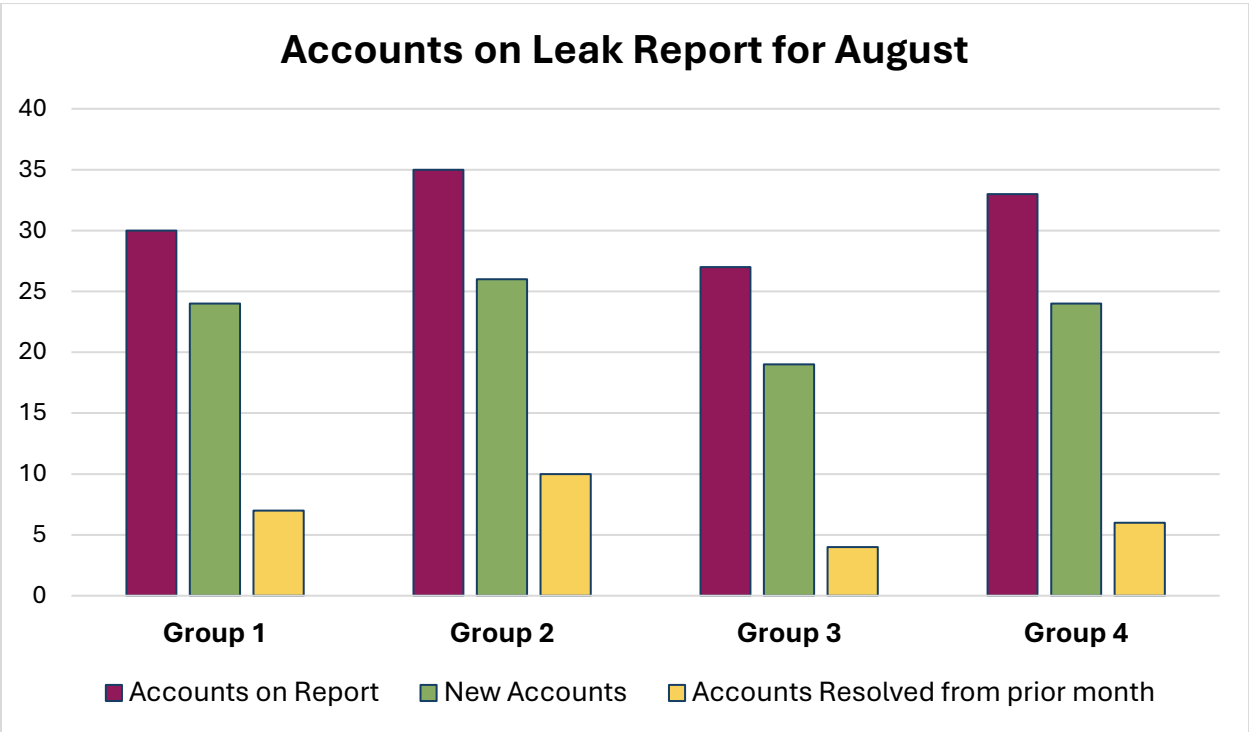
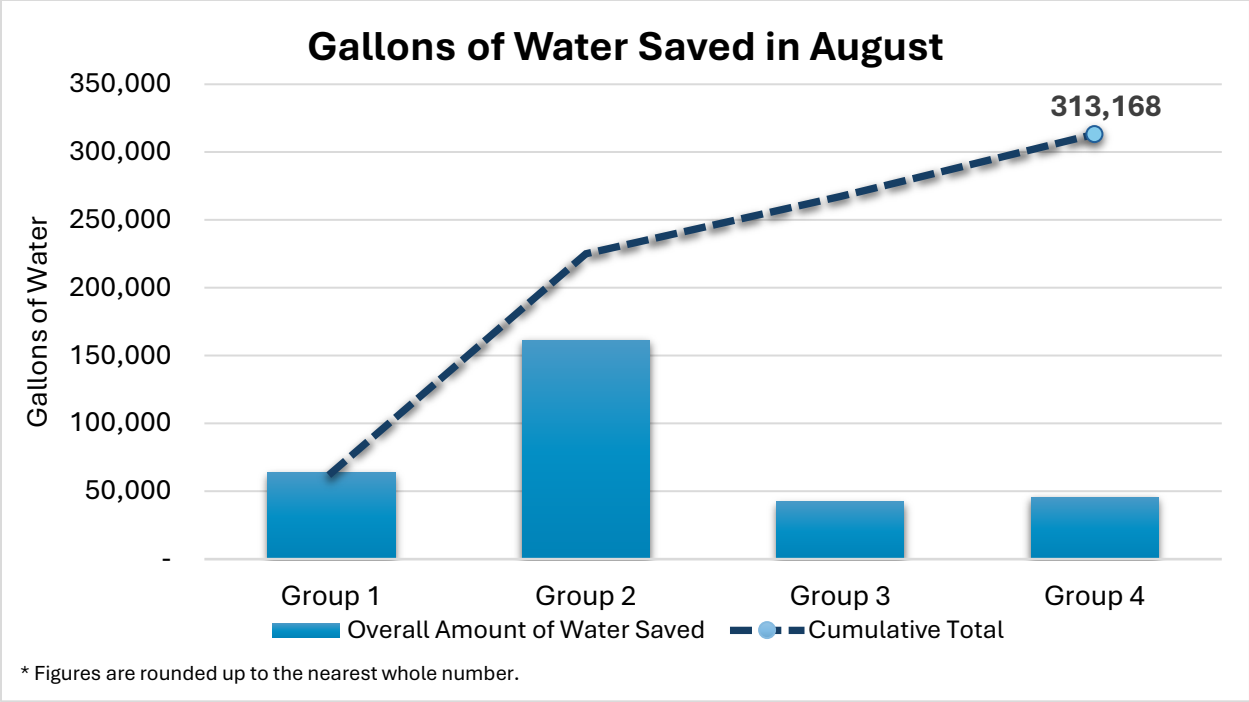
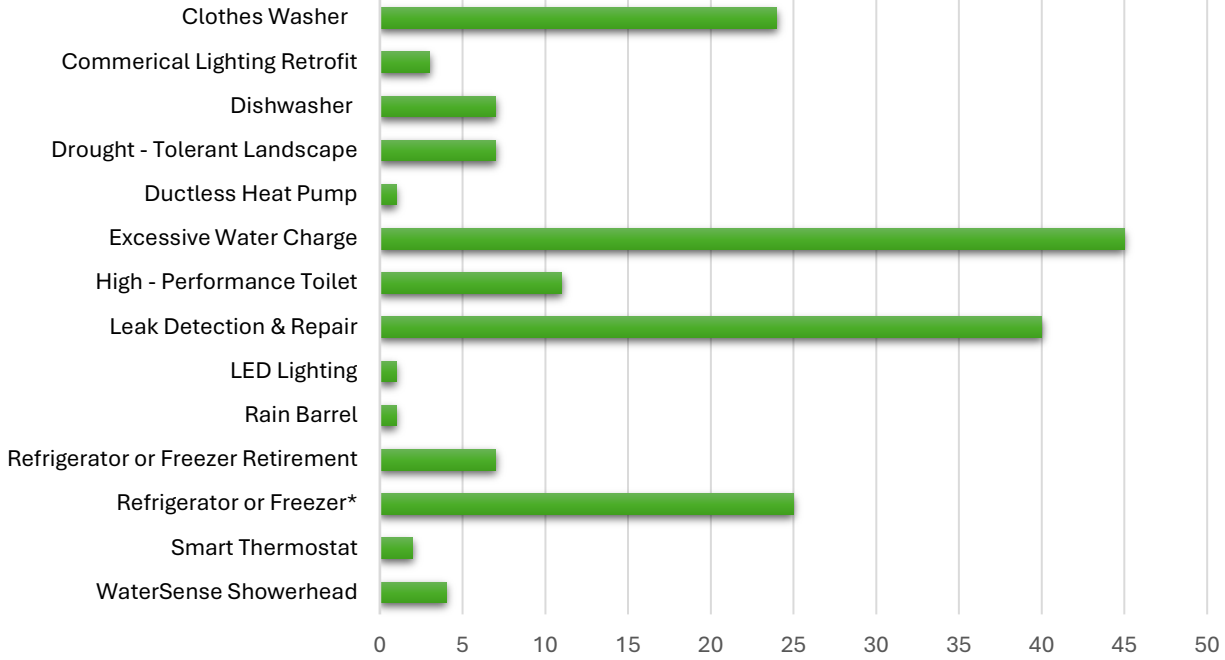


## Utility Commission Report

The Conservation Team (Team) completed leak reports for all groups as well as the Rebate Activity Report and the invoicing for August. The Team also participated in a “Touch-a-Truck” event with the Solid Waste Division after the Lompoc Library’s popular Storytime Tuesday series and will also be participating in the upcoming Community Block & Resource Fair at Fillmore Elementary Community School. The Utility Conservation Coordinator (Coordinator) met with the Lompoc Valley Botanical & Horticulture Society and provided a quick overview of the project to complete Drought Tolerant Demonstration Gardens at the Water Treatment Plant. The Coordinator also met with CommUnify and discussed plans for partnering more effectively together for the benefit of City of Lompoc residents. Additionally, the Coordinator attended various meetings and submitted the August 2025 Single Urban Drought & Conservation Report to the State Water Resources Control Board. The Holiday Lights Exchange materials were received, and utility bill inserts with a flyer outlining the program, available in both English and Spanish, were sent out. A non-compliant multifamily residential water account within a large housing complex was referred to the Legal Department due to hundreds of ordinance violations of the City of Lompoc’s No Water Wasting Restrictions and a lack of action to resolve or perform any due diligence on their part. Progress was made on several energy efficiency projects, including at the Police Department Headquarters and Lompoc Museum, with the latter nearing completion. Updates were made to the calculation of the additional credit for Excessive Water Charges related to the Water Leak Detection and Repair Rebate. Moving forward, the calculation will consider the actual leak start date, rather than the date the system flags the issue, which is typically seven days later.
